SMARTCARDS

Smartcards may be re-valued at any time through breakfast, break or lunch service. Cheques should be made payable to "Chartwells", with the student's name and smartcard number written on the back. There is a spending limit of £4.00 per day.

A lost card must be reported to a member of the catering staff in order that it may be stopped. A new card can be purchased for £2. Any credit balance will then be transferred.

Smartcards used by students entitled to free school meals, are not identifiable when compared with ordinary smartcards. Free school meal cards are re-valued automatically, and if a student forgets their card they will still be able to have a main meal and pudding.

Smartcards should be kept in a clean wallet or purse to protect the chip.
